

As the President of the Victoria Police Games Federation (VPGF), a position I am proud to hold, I am honoured to launch the 2023 Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games

We all know the benefits of an active lifestyle and the positive impact it can have on our physical and mental health and wellbeing. Finding time for family, friends, sport, or exercise is a challenge we all face, but it is particularly important for those working in the emergency management sector. The Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games are about more than competition – they are an opportunity for us to come together, prioritise our own physical and mental health, and invest in the friendships that characterise the spirit of the Games.

With the 2022 Games returning to a 10-day schedule and back to a more traditional setup, our agency members were spoiled for choice with over 43 sports to participate in. To kickstart the 2022 Games, I was fortunate to be joined by fellow agency leaders, VPGF Life Members, sports coordinators, and corporate partners, at URBN Surf in Tullamarine. We were treated to a surfing demonstration by several agency members – a fantastic preview ahead of the Games' first ever surfing event to be held in a wave pool.

In addition to surfing, it was fantastic to introduce Powerlifting as a new sport for 2022, which proved to be popular with both men and women. Mountain biking returned from a two-year hiatus and a full triathlon, in partnership with the Western Suburbs Triathlon Club, was held for the first time in nearly ten years. Overall participation numbers were up 7% on 2021, with 2,563 participants overall. 30 different agencies were represented across the 10-day program, with a total of 4,167 individual entries into the events.

Congratulations to Corrections Victoria on winning the 2022 Inter-Services Trophy for the third year in a row, and the Transit and Public Safety Command on taking out the 2022 Chief Commissioners Trophy for the fifth consecutive year. But more importantly, congratulations to everyone who took part. There was wonderful comradery between the agencies and participants which confirmed why these Games are so important to Emergency Services workers.

The VPGF Committee and its stakeholders are hard at work planning for the 2023 Games. With the easing of COVID restrictions and the return of community sport over the past 12 months, we look forward to once again providing an opportunity for agency members to participate in some healthy competition. I am excited to introduce Sailing to the schedule for next year and look forward to continuing our strong partnerships with venues, local clubs and associations, local councils, and state and national sporting associations.

I am extremely grateful for the sustained support of our corporate partners and thank them for their investment in the 2023 Games. ESSSuper, APS Benefits, Transurban and BankVic are continuing as valued partners. Web developers FUSESport will again provide their generous support for our online registration portal and Games website. General Information

Registration and entry to the 2023 Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games is on-line ONLY. To register, please go to www. emergencyservicesgames.org.au. All registrations and payments for events are done through the online portal. All participants will be required to create their own new account or use their previous account. Registrations for all events will open in December 2022 and close 20th March 2023. The Games will run from 27th March to 3rd April 2023.

There is a standard registration fee of \$10 per participant and is required upon registration. Payment of this fee covers:

- Registration processing
- Website development
- · Administrative and volunteer costs

Sports fees are also required and are applicable to each sport and competitors may enter as many sports as they wish, paying the appropriate sport fee for each sport.

Payment of this fee covers:

- Medals
- Venue costs
- Equipment and catering costs
- Umpires, officials and prizes

Payments are only accepted online via the registration portal. The portal uses the PayPal gateway so participants can either use their PayPal account to pay their fees or payment can be made via credit card. No payments of cash will be accepted at any events.

Event Entries on the day: Entry into events on the day of competition, at the event venue, will generally not be permitted. Competitors must have registered and paid online prior to the commencement of the event as specified above. Some exceptions do apply – please contact the relevant Sports Coordinator.

Enquiries regarding your individual sporting event are to be directed to the respective Sports Coordinator in the first instance. For any registration queries or general information about the Games, contact the Games Manager on 8533 1689 or via email to info@ emergencyservicesgames.org.au.

COVID Regulations: In order to maintain a healthy Games environment, all participants, as well as officials, coordinators, volunteers, and support staff must continue to wear a face mask when required and must sanitise their hands regularly, maintain

social distance when required, and should not attend any event if they feel unwell. Whilst COVID Safe Plans are no longer required, we request any participant that tests positive to COVID in the leadup or on their event day, do not participate to protect the health and safety of other participants.

In the Conditions of Entry, you must have had an approved COVID vaccination to participate (medical exemptions apply). The VPGF is committed to providing a safe environment for all its participants, coordinators and volunteers and supports the governments advice on COVID vaccinations.

Refund Policy:

Refunds will be granted under the following circumstances:

- Should a registered participant seek a refund prior to the official close of registrations (20/3/23), they will be granted a refund of the relevant sport/s fees only unless otherwise at the discretion of the Games Manager.
- Participants must notify the relevant Sports
 Coordinator or the Games Manager by email or
 phone call at least two days prior to their event.
 In this case, a refund of the relevant sport/s fees
 only will be granted if they can't compete due to
 illness or injury; family tragedy; unexpected 'on
 duty' requirements or emergency situations; or
 any other circumstances to be considered by the
 Games Manager.
- Participants are only eligible for a full refund (registration & sport fees) if:
 - their event is cancelled or moved to another day and they can't compete.
 - If a competitor has entered an event after the maximum number of competitors has been reached, but before the advertised close of entries (if this event is the only event they have entered).
 - If they need to withdraw due to a COVID case.

Should a registered participant fail to compete and not notify their Sports Coordinator, or the Games Office of their absence as described above, they are not entitled to a refund of any kind.

Any refunds will be processed through the Fusesport online system and Paypal gateway with refunds returning to the original credit card that was used when registering.



Event Cancellation: Any sport or event may be cancelled by mutual agreement between the respective Sport Coordinator and the Games Federation. It is the responsibility of the Sports Coordinator to contact all competitors when an event is cancelled. Agency Representatives are also available to assist in this instance. In these circumstances a full refund of the registration and sports fee will be made available to the individuals concerned.

Maximum/Minimum Number of Participants: Some sports may set a maximum number of participants due to competition and /or venue restrictions. If a competitor has entered an event after the maximum has been reached and was received late and after the advertised close of entries, the entrant shall only be eligible to receive a refund of the sport fee. Every sport has a minimum number required for the competition to proceed. If a minimum number is not reached, then the sport will be cancelled. In this case, the event cancellation policy will apply

Public Liability Protection: All sporting events in the Games are covered for Public Liability Insurance under the banner of Victoria Police

Personal Injury Cover:

Victoria Police: The Victoria Police Games Federation strongly encourages all participants to have their own private health insurance including Ambulance cover. For Victoria Police employees only competing in the Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games, should an injury occur, they are entitled to submit an injury claim to their relevant WorkCover representative.

Whilst Victoria Police may have some influence over whether a claim is supported, ultimately the decision on claim acceptance is made by WorkSafe's delegated WorkCover Insurance Agent to determine if there is liability for a claim under the WIRC Act which is the relevant legislation.

Victoria Police members are encouraged to contact their WorkCover consultant or the Games Office for further information.

Other Participating Agencies: Participants from all other affiliated agencies outside of Victoria Police are not covered under the above policy. Participants need to check with their own agency regarding any personal insurance cover whilst participating in the Games.

Injuries that occur as a result of participating in the 2023 Games must be reported to the Sports Coordinator as soon as possible and recorded using a specific 'Injury/Incidence Report' form.

All competitors should be in a healthy physical condition and ready for competition to maximise enjoyment and to minimise personal injury. If unsure, or competing in strenuous competition, please consult your physician before commencing competition.

Appeals and Protests by competitors shall be made in the first instance to the Sports Coordinator of their event. The Sports Coordinator has total control over the running of their event on the day. Should a mutual resolution not be made, the competitor can lodge a further appeal in writing to the Victoria Police Games Federation Executive Officer within 24 hours of their event. The VPGF will then investigate and notify the competitor and Sports Coordinator of the result.

If the presentation of medals is affected by the possible results of a protest/dispute, the awards shall be withheld pending the Protest/Dispute decision.

On-Duty Status: All participants should check with their agency representative about their onduty status when participating in these Games. All agencies will have different policies and it is at the discretion of each agency as to whether this applies.

Changes to Events Policy: The Victoria Police Games Federation reserves the right to alter or make changes to the times, dates, locations, and event programming wherever and whenever necessary. Notification of any changes will be supplied to an effected competitor and placed on the website.

Alcohol and Drugs: The use of banned performance enhancing substances and methods by competitors (as listed by the Australian Sports Drugs Agency) is prohibited for the Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games. Furthermore, Sports Coordinators may prohibit any person from competing in any event or competition if in their opinion that person is displaying the effects of alcohol.

Blood and Infectious Disease Policy: All cuts and abrasions must be reported to the Sport Coordinator immediately and first aid treatment applied. A competitor who is bleeding or has blood on their clothing must immediately leave the playing area and seek medical assistance. The bleeding must be stopped, the wound dressed and blood on the player's body or clothing cleaned off before

they return to the game. Play must cease until all visible blood is cleaned up. Sport Coordinators have discretion as to whether any contaminated clothing or equipment will need to be replaced prior to the competitor being allowed to continue in the competition. A competitor may only return to competition once the Sports Coordinator is confident all the steps listed above have been taken. Any person with an infectious disease must advise the Sport Coordinator prior to the start of any competition. The Sport Coordinator shall advise the competitor whether they are able to take their place in the competition.

Officials, Coordinators & Volunteers will be identified by distinctive clothing/badges, and they should always be treated with the utmost courtesy. Participants are asked to follow their directions at all times.

Spectators will not be permitted onto the Field of play at any venue unless approved by the Sports Coordinator. Spectators are encouraged to support all competitors on event days. Assistance is requested from all parents to supervise their children in the vicinity of all sporting areas.

Photographer: An official Games photographer will attend various sporting events. Photographs & videos will be available for private viewing upon completion of the Games. There may also be other photographers at events which have been organised by the Sports Coordinator and approved by the Games Office. By consenting to participate in the 2023 VPES Games, you are granting permission to use any image involving yourself for promotional material.

Security: All Sports Coordinators are responsible for securing their venues and equipment against damage. Competitors are responsible for their own property. Each sport also has its own 'Security Strategy' devised by the Sports Coordinator and submitted to the Games Office prior to their event/s commencing. The VPGF also asks every participant to be aware about the need for increased vigilance when conduct sporting events in today's environment. Competitors are asked to have their agency identification with them at the events they are competing at. Should the relevant identification not be shown when asked by the Sports Coordinator, then the individual may be asked to leave the premises and not take part in the Games.

Risk Management: The Games Federation has a commitment to use risk management practices to support and enhance all the sporting events in the Games. A 'Risk Management Action Plan' and 'Facility Safety & Game Day Readiness Checklist' is completed by each Sports Coordinator to ensure that sports event venues are 'fit for purpose', and action plans are designed to reduce the likelihood and consequence of injury. Further to this Sports Coordinators now include a 'Security Strategy' as part of their action plans as mentioned above.

Results of all events and sports will be posted on the Games website under the "Results" section as soon as they have been received by the Games Office from the Sports Coordinators. Coordinators are asked to finalise their results and send them through as soon as possible.

Medal Presentations will be made at the conclusion of the final of each event or at the discretion of the Sports Coordinator. Placegetters who do not attend medal presentation ceremonies MUST arrange delivery of their medals through the Sport Coordinator. The presentation for the Chief Commissioner's Trophy and the Inter-Services Trophy will be made at the discretion of the VPGF Executive. The winners will be acknowledged at the launch of the Games for the following year.

Victoria Police Games Federation Chief Commissioner's Trophy & the Inter-Services Trophy

As there can be a large difference in the number of personnel attached to each Agency and Police Department, the weighting factor ensures that all Agencies/Departments compete on an equal basis. This weighting factor better reflects the participation rates of staff within the Agencies/Departments, making the process fairer overall. This process incorporates a participation percentage, bonus points for competitors who enter more than one event, and medal points for placings. The trophies will be awarded to the Agency/Department gaining the highest number of points (combination of total participation and medal points). Every member of a competing agency taking part in the Games will earn participation points for his or her agency/department and medal points for placings. Victoria Police entrants to the Games MUST nominate the region, department or command to which their points are to be awarded upon registration.



retired Police Veterans are not eligible to compete for The Chief Commissioner's Trophy whilst retired emergency services personnel and volunteers are eligible to compete for the Inter-Services trophy if they meet the respective criteria.

Scratching's will automatically penalize the Agency the equivalent participation points. Withdrawals due to illness or injury will not attract a penalty.

Calculating Bonus Points and Total Participation Percentage. The bonus points for each agency are based on the average number of entries per competitor per agency

For example: **Agency/Department** A has 100 staff members, 50 competitors and 75 entries. The percentage of employees competing is 50%, and the average number of entries per competitor 1.50. The average number of entries per competitor is applied as a weighting to the participation percentage to give

a total participation percentage of 75%. The total participation percentage is then ranked from highest to lowest, and agencies assigned a rank score.

Bonus Points. Medal points will be awarded to place getters as follows: 1st (5 points), 2nd (3 points) and 3rd (1 point). Each agency's total number of medal points is added up and ranked from highest to lowest and agencies assigned a rank score. More information on the allocation of points can be found in clause 11 of the Conditions of Entry.

Overall ranking. The rank scores from the total participation percentage and the medal points are then added together, and the Agency/Department with the highest score wins.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Agency Eligibility

- 1.1 Eligible Agencies that are able to compete in these Games and who are affiliated with the Victoria Police Games Federation are: Victoria Police including Protective Services Officers and Police Custody Officers; Ambulance Victoria; Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission: Australian Border Force: Australian Department of Agriculture. Fisheries and Forestry; Australian Federal Police (including Australian Protective Service Officers): Australian Volunteer Coast Guard; Corrections Victoria; Country Fire Authority; Dept of Jobs, Precincts & Regions; Dept of Environment, Land, 2.3 Water and Planning: Dept. of Immigration: Dept of Justice (Sheriff's Office); Dept of Transport; Emergency Management Victoria; Emergency Services Telecommunications Authority; Fire Rescue Victoria; Life Saving Victoria: National Heavy Vehicle Regulator: Parks Victoria; Royal Flying Doctor Service; Safe Transport Victoria: St John Ambulance Victoria: Victoria State Emergency Service: and Victorian Fisheries Authority.
- 1.2 Other emergency service agencies can apply for eligibility and if successful are able to compete upon invitation to attend these Games.
- 1.3 The Victoria Police Games Federation reserves the right to refuse entries from any individual or agency.

2. Participant Eligibility

- 2.1 Participants over the age of 18 from eligible agencies may only compete if they satisfy one or more of the criteria below:
- They are a current or retired sworn or unsworn member of Victoria Police (including PSO's & PCO's)
- Have a Law Enforcement or Emergency Response role as specified in their key accountabilities section of their job description
- Are an active and registered volunteer for at least 12 months prior to the Games and have completed the appropriate training for their organisation

- d) retired member of an agency (except Victoria Police, see 2.1a) must have had 10 or more years' service to that agency prior to resignation. These members will be referred to their Agency Representatives.
- 2.2 Where a member of the Victoria Police resigns and wishes to take part in further Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games, consideration will be given to a member's history of involvement in previous Victoria Police and Emergency Services Games, and the years of service. Applications must be made in writing to the VPGF Office prior to registration.
- 2.3 The Committee of the Victoria Police Games Federation Inc. may by resolution, caution counsel or reprimand a member of the Federation or may expel or suspend a member from involvement in the affairs of the Federation, which shall include competing at the Games. This includes members that:
- (a) have refused or neglected to comply with the Rules of the Federation; or
- b) have been found guilty of discreditable conduct or conduct prejudicial to the interests of the Federation, in accordance with Clauses 21 of the Rules of Management of the Federation.
- c) Any competitor who is currently under suspension from their agency is not permitted to enter. In addition, where a competitor is suspended after having registered for the Games, the onus is on the competitor to declare that suspension to the Victoria Police Games Federation and withdraw from the Games.
- 2.4 The VPGF reserves the right to refuse entries from any person
- 2.5 Other non-affiliated Emergency Service personnel who comply with clause 2.1 can make an application to the Games Manager for consideration of their eligibility.
- 2.6 As per Victorian Government Health directions, all participants must be vaccinated from Coronavirus prior to the commencement of the Games (except if a medical exemption applies). Proof of vaccination status may be required prior to commencing any entered event or entering any facility. This clause also includes coordinators, volunteers and support staff.



- 3.1 Victorian Police Protective Services Officers (PSO) will compete for Transit & Public Safety Command as their department. Police Custody Officers (PCO) will compete for the Regions in which they are managed from.
- 3.2 Victoria Police individuals MUST register for the region, command or department they are assigned to at the time of registration. Members attached to PCETS MUST compete for the region where they are located at the time of entry.
- 4.1 Entries officially close on Sunday 20th March 2023. Some sports may accept late entries however this will be at the discretion of the respective Sports Coordinator. All entries are via the online registration system and payment must be made to complete the registration process. Credit Card (Mastercard or Visa) or PayPal account are the only forms of payment. For information on refunds, please check the Refund section contained within the General Information document.
- 4.2 Entry fees may vary from sport to sport and are put towards the running costs of the event, such as medals, venue hire and payment of officials etc. Fees for some sports will be the basic entry fee plus "pay as you play" costs. Entry fees are listed with the events, along with those listed as "pay as you play".
- 4.3 Sports co-ordinators will not accept a team entry unless full administration / registration details of all members of the team have been received, and full payment has been made.
- 4.4 The Games will be conducted at various venues throughout Victoria between 27th March and 3rd April 2023 inclusive. A Schedule of Events is listed on the Games website (www.emergencyservicesgames. org.au) and in the Games Information booklet.
- 5.1 All employees of Victoria Police are required to participate in their own time and at their own expense. Victoria Police employees should check the information regarding Personal Accident Insurance which is contained in the General Information for Participants document.
- 5.2 All other participants from affiliated agencies are not covered under the Victoria Police

- policy therefore need to refer to their own agency internal leave policy and insurance cover. It is recommended that you discuss any issues with your agency representative or private insurance contact. More information is provided on the General Information for Participants page.
- 5.3 Any person employed by Victoria Police who competes in The Games whilst on sick leave WILL NOT be eligible for the Personal Accident and Public Liability protection and competes at their own risk. Employees on sick leave who wish to compete will need to provide medical clearance first.
- Age/Sex/Unisex Divisions apply to some individual events. The placegetters in each age/sex/unisex division will be awarded medals. The divisions are:

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The age groups above apply to male, female and unisex competitors in the relevant events and are identified by the letters M and F respectively throughout the program and are to be taken as at 20th March 2022.

- 7. All entrants are reminded that they are eligible to enter both their own age group and the open age group but must pay the entry fees for BOTH age groups. They may be required to compete in BOTH age groups, except in the case of Cross Country and Cycling events where entries will only be accepted in age groups, and the Open age group (if available) will be decided by times. Swimming events, both Open Water and Pool, entries will only be accepted in age groups.
- Females will compete against females unless they specify that they wish to enter a mixed OPEN or unisex event. Some events may combine various age/sex divisions e.g. 5000 metres.
- Where insufficient entries are received in age group events, the entrant will be offered the opportunity to participate in a lower age group.
- 10.1 Participants representing Victoria Police in non-individual events are encouraged to be registered with members from the same department so that they can achieve bonus points as per clause 11 below.
- 10.2 Participants from all other agencies competing in non-individual events can compete without representing a particular region or department due to the smaller number of participants representing them in comparison to the numbers representing Victoria Police. Competitors may only compete in one team per sport on the day of their event. Team members SHOULD play in the preliminaries to be eligible for the finals. The end decision rests with the Sports Coordinator.
- 10.3 Where a person wishes to compete in a non-individual event and is unable to locate sufficient numbers to make up a region or department team, or doubles event, their entry will be set aside until after the closing date for entries. A draw will then be conducted from those individual entries with

the view to making a composite team and that entrant will be able to compete in the Games.

11. Bonus Points

- 11.1 Bonus Points are awarded in all events with 5 points going to 1st place, 3 points to 2nd place, & 1 point to 3rd place. Bonus points help determine the winners of the Inter-Services & Chief Commissioner's Trophies.
- 11.2 In all individual events, the participant earns the bonus points for their agency whilst Victoria Police participants also earn bonus points for their department.
- 11.3 In all non-individual events/team events, Bonus Points will be allocated this way:
- a) Only 1 set of bonus points will be allocated to an agency per non-individual/team event to the 1st, 2nd & 3rd placegetters (eg. winning team will get 5 points only to their agency and will not be individually allocated to the participants). These points will be included in the calculation for the Inter-Services Trophy. Where there is more than 1 participant from a different agency involved in the makeup of the entry, the bonus points will be awarded to the participant and their agency who setup the online entry (eg, team manager or captain).
- b) Where a person wishes to compete in a nonindividual/team event with members from another region or department within Victoria Police, they will each be granted Bonus Points towards their department should they place 1st, 2nd or 3rd, with these points contributing to the Chief Commissioner's Trophy. Clause 11.3a will apply when calculating points for the Inter-Services Trophy.
- 12. By participating in the Victoria Police & Emergency Services Games, you give permission for the Victoria Police Games Federation to use any photo and/or video of you participating for promotional material. Please note that no photo will be used of any participant who is in their work attire nor will any names associated with any photo/video be published.

What is the ESF?

The Emergency Services Foundation (ESF) is a NFP peak body that is solely dedicated to Victoria's emergency worker mental health injury prevention.

Why is it important?

Compared to the general Australian population, the people who serve our community are at higher risk of mental health distress (Beyond Blue 2018; Australian Parliament 2019). Families too, and staff in support roles are at heightened risk as they are exposed vicariously through communication with emergency responders and affected communities.

Indications are that this situation is getting worse, driven by a constantly increasing workload from more frequent and more intense cycles of response and recovery to disasters.

What does ESF do?

ESF collaborates with 14 key sector organisations to pioneer leading practice to address the challenge of helping people to flourish so the State's emergency response capability is not at risk. Up to this point attention has been focused on the provision of services to treat mental illness and injury, with little focus on early intervention and prevention. ESF is addressing this gap through initiatives which integrate to provide a comprehensive prevention led 'psychological immunisation'.


